STAFF ASSESSMENT

I. ACTION PROPOSED

Staff recommends approval of the renewal petition for Equitas Academy 5 ("Charter School"), located in Board District 5 and Region West, for a term of five (5) years, beginning July 1, 2026, until June 30, 2031, to serve up to 500 students in grades TK-4 in each year of the charter term.

II. RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS

Upon submission, District staff comprehensively reviews each renewal petition application to determine whether the school has met the requirements for renewal set forth in Education Code sections 47605, 47607, 47607.2, and 47611.5.

Criteria for Charter School Renewal and Grounds for Nonrenewal

As part of staff's holistic review of the renewal petition application, the charter school must be determined to be eligible for renewal of its charter under the specific renewal criteria outlined in the Charter Schools Act. The renewal criteria prescribed in Education Code sections 47607 and 47607.2 requires a three-pronged analysis:

• **Criterion 1:** Does the renewal petition include a sound educational program, a reasonably comprehensive description of the 15 elements required for petitions, an affirmation of each of the conditions described in Education Code section 47605(e), and are petitioners demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition? (Ed. Code, § 47607(b).)

These criteria have been determined not to be bases for denial.

• Criterion 2: Is the charter school "high," "middle," or "low" performing? (see Ed. Code, §§ 47607(c), 47607.2(a), and 47607.2(b).) Has the charter school attained measurable increases in academic achievement schoolwide and for numerically significant student groups served by the charter school, and does the charter school have strong postsecondary outcomes, if applicable?

These criteria have been determined not to be bases for denial.

• **Criterion 3:** Is the charter school serving all pupils who wish to attend, or does the charter school have substantial fiscal or governance issues? (Ed. Code, § 47607(e).)

These criteria have been determined not to be bases for denial.

Charter Petition Requirement:

In accordance with Education Code section 47611.5, a charter school charter shall contain a declaration regarding whether or not the charter school shall be deemed the exclusive public school employer of the employees at the charter school for the purposes of Section 3540.1 of the Government Code, and that declaration shall not be materially inconsistent with the charter.

B. Charter School Operator

Equitas Academy 5 is operated by Equitas Academy Charter School, Inc., a California nonprofit public benefit corporation that also operates six (6) other LAUSD-authorized charter schools.

IV. STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AND EDUCATIONAL PERFORMANCE

a. Summary

Equitas Academy 5 has been identified by the state as a Middle performing charter school. The recommendation for renewal has considered the schoolwide performance and performance of numerically significant student groups and the state and local indicators reported on the California School Dashboard, and whether there was clear and convincing verified data evidence showing the school demonstrated measurable increases in academic achievement, as

defined by at least one year's progress in each year in school, and/or strong postsecondary outcomes, as applicable.

Overall, Charter School's Dashboard performance was lower than the state in ELA, but higher than the state in Math and on the English Language Progress Indicator (ELPI). The charter school provided two years of verified data in ELA and Math demonstrating mixed results, incomplete student group data, and participation rate concerns. Further analysis in ELA demonstrated higher outcomes for the charter school when compared to Resident Schools.

b. Measurements of Academic Performance on the California School Dashboard

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2022 Dashboard only displayed one year of data (also known as Status). Status Levels are reported based on the 2021-2022 school year data using one of five Status Levels (ranging from Very High, High, Medium, Low, and Very Low) for state measures. Please note that the Status Levels associated with the Chronic Absenteeism and Suspension Rate Indicators are reversed (ranging from Very Low, Low, Medium, High, and Very High). Below, the 2023 and 2024 Dashboard Performance Levels (colors) based on two years' data are provided.

Schools assigned "Pair and Share" data only receive schoolwide performance data and do not receive student group performance data. In 2022 in English Language Arts (ELA), the charter school's Distance from Standard (DFS) was lower than the state for All Students. In 2023 and 2024 in ELA, the charter school's DFS was lower than the state for All Students, and lower than the state for two of three numerically significant student groups.

ELA

Charter School provided data for Reading from "i-Ready K-8 by Curriculum Associates" (i-Ready) *Diagnostic Growth* report 2024-2025 ("Final Diagnostic") for All Students and for the following student groups: English Learner, Latino, and Students with Disabilities. i-Ready is an adopted academic progress indicator approved by the SBE to be on the verified data list.

Per Education Code section 47607.2 (c)(2), the SBE established criteria to define verified data. To be eligible for inclusion as verified data, a data source (e.g., assessment or postsecondary outcome) must include the results of at least 95 percent of eligible students. Although the i-Ready *Diagnostic Growth* report shows the number of students assessed and the number of students currently enrolled, i-Ready's publisher (Curriculum Associates) has shared that these numbers do not constitute an official participation rate that would reflect which students *should* have been tested, thereby an official participation rate is not provided. The *Diagnostic Growth* report provided by Charter School reported 153 students were assessed in Reading and 153 students were enrolled in i-Ready. Thus, based on the information provided by Charter School, the 2024-2025 assessment data appears to include at least 95% of eligible students.

For Reading, the i-Ready *Diagnostic Growth* report indicated that the Median Progress to Annual Typical Growth is 75%. Per the California SBE May 2023 Agenda Item #02, publisher guidance states, "Typical Growth marks the annual growth of an average student at a given placement. It provides a comparative or normative view of growth, answering how students are growing relative to comparable peers." Therefore, based on i-Ready's Median Progress to Typical Growth targets¹ to identify schools as having met California Charter School growth expectations, and Curriculum Associates recommendation "that schools that achieve a year's worth of growth, adjusted for error, have exhibited sufficient growth," Charter School met for All Students in Reading in 2024-2025.

As seen in the table below, Charter School provided the most recent data for three student groups and all three student groups demonstrated one year's progress based on i-Ready's Median Progress to Typical Growth Targets in 2024-2025.

Charter School also submitted verified data using "MAP Growth by NWEA, Grades K-12" (NWEA) *Student Growth Summary Report* in Reading for the 2023-2024 school year. Based on NWEA's CGI range of -0.2 to 0.2, Charter School met the one year's progress for a majority of Grade Levels. Charter School did not provide student group reports for consideration as verified data.

MATH

Charter School provided data for Math from an "i-Ready K-8 by Curriculum Associates" (i-Ready) *Diagnostic Growth* report for 2024-2025 ("Final Diagnostic") for All Students and for the following student groups: English Learner, Latino, and Students with Disabilities. i-Ready is an adopted academic progress indicator approved by the California SBE to be on the verified data list.

Per Education Code section 47607.2 (c)(2), the SBE established criteria to define verified data. To be eligible for inclusion as verified data, a data source (e.g., assessment or postsecondary outcome) must include the results of at least 95 percent of eligible students. Although the i-Ready *Diagnostic Growth* report shows the number of students assessed and the number of students currently enrolled, i-Ready's publisher (Curriculum Associates) has shared that these numbers do not constitute an official participation rate that would reflect which students *should* have been tested, thereby an official participation rate is not provided. The *Diagnostic Growth* report provided by Charter School reported 153 students were assessed in Math and 153 students were enrolled in i-Ready. Thus, based on the information provided by Charter School, the 2024-2025 assessment data appears to include at least 95% of eligible students.

For Math, the i-Ready *Diagnostic Growth* report indicated that the Median Progress to Annual Typical Growth is 80%. Based on i-Ready's Median Progress to Typical Growth targets² to identify schools as having met California Charter School growth expectations, and Curriculum Associates recommendation "that schools that achieve a year's worth of growth, adjusted for error, have exhibited sufficient growth," Charter School met for All Students in Math in 2024-2025.

As seen in the table below, Charter School provided the most recent data for three student groups and all three student groups did not demonstrate one year's progress based on i-Ready's Median Progress to Typical Growth Targets in 2024-2025.

Charter School also submitted verified data using "MAP Growth by NWEA, Grades K-12" (NWEA) *Student Growth Summary Report* in Math for the 2023-2024 school year. Based on NWEA's CGI range of -0.2 to 0.2, Charter School met the one year's progress for a majority of Grade Levels. Charter School did not provide student group reports for consideration as verified data.

Based on the review and consideration of verified data, Equitas Academy 5 included two years of data. The 2024-2025 i-Ready data included schoolwide and student group reports (English Learner, Latino, and Students with Disabilities) for both Reading and Math. Equitas Academy 5 appears to have met 95 percent participation rate schoolwide and for all numerically significant student groups. However, the 2023-2024 MAP Growth by NWEA data does not appear to include at least 95% of eligible students.

VII. FURTHER ANALYSIS FOR MIDDLE PERFORMING CHARTER SCHOOLS

Following the review of the foregoing performance data for this charter school placing a greater weight on academic performance on the California School Dashboard, and considering Charter School provided only one year of schoolwide and student group verified data, staff determined that the school's performance in ELA requires further review.

Based on the charter school's performance on California School Dashboard in ELA and the submitted verified data by the charter school, Staff conducted a further analysis of ELA in comparison to the Resident Schools Median (RSM).³ As indicated in the tables below, when comparing the school to the RSM, Equitas Academy 5's data indicates that its student performance on California School Dashboard in 2022, 2023, and 2024 was higher than the RSM for All Students and for all numerically significant student groups in ELA.

¹ On May 13, 2025 the LAUSD Board of Education approved the material revision application for Collegiate Charter High School of Los Angeles, a 9-12 charter school, to transfer its operations, governance and management to Equitas, which was implemented starting July 1, 2025. Equitas will manage this high school along with six (6) other LAUSD-authorized charter schools.

On September 9, 2025, Equitas submitted a five-year financial plan and cash flow projections showing the reversal of the charter operator's negative financial condition by the end of FY 2024-2025, including the repayment of intraorganizational borrowing, from the receipt of the Employee Retention Credit approved by the Internal Revenue Service. The projections also indicate that Equitas will maintain positive net assets and sufficient cash flow without reliance on intraorganizational borrowing. The CSD will continue to monitor Equitas' financial condition as part of its oversight process.

² The Equitas charter operator (excluding related parties and charter schools) has reported negative net assets from FY 2019-2020 through FY 2023-2024—(\$357,410), (\$1,173,152), (\$1,517,815), (\$1,445,048), and (\$1,411,895), respectively—supported by \$1,857,685 in intraorganizational borrowing from Equitas charter schools as of June 30, 2024. Equitas explained that the charter operator's negative financial condition was due to various events occurring in FY 2019-2020 through 2021-2022.
