STAFF ASSESSMENT

I. ACTION PROPOSED

Staff recommends approval of the renewal petition for Pacoima Charter Elementary ("Charter School"), located in Board District 6 and Region North, for a term of five (5) years, beginning July 1, 2026, until June 30, 2031, to serve up to 1,300 students in grades TK-6 in each year of the charter term. The school is requesting to reduce enrollment capacity from 1,528 to 1,300 students to align with its enrollment projections based on its enrollment trends in the current term.

II. RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS

Upon submission, District staff comprehensively reviews each renewal petition application to determine whether the school has met the requirements for renewal set forth in Education Code sections 47605, 47607, 47607.2, and 47611.5.

Criteria for Charter School Renewal and Grounds for Nonrenewal

As part of staff's holistic review of the renewal petition application, the charter school must be determined to be eligible for renewal of its charter under the specific renewal criteria outlined in the Charter Schools Act. The renewal criteria prescribed in Education Code sections 47607 and 47607.2 requires a three-pronged analysis:

• Criterion 1: Does the renewal petition include a sound educational program, a reasonably comprehensive description of the 15 elements required for petitions, an affirmation of each of the conditions described in Education Code section 47605(e), and are petitioners demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition? (Ed. Code, § 47607(b).)

These criteria have been determined not to be bases for denial.

• Criterion 2: Is the charter school "high," "middle," or "low" performing? (see Ed. Code, §§ 47607(c), 47607.2(a), and 47607.2(b).) Has the charter school attained measurable increases in academic achievement schoolwide and for numerically significant student groups served by the charter school, and does the charter school have strong postsecondary outcomes, if applicable?

These criteria have been determined not to be bases for denial.

• Criterion 3: Is the charter school serving all pupils who wish to attend, or does the charter school have substantial fiscal or governance issues? (Ed. Code, § 47607(e).)

These criteria have been determined not to be bases for denial.

Charter Petition Requirement:

In accordance with Education Code section 47611.5, a charter school charter shall contain a declaration regarding whether or not the charter school shall be deemed the exclusive public school employer of the employees at the charter school for the purposes of Section 3540.1 of the Government Code, and that declaration shall not be materially inconsistent with the charter.

B. Charter School Operator

Pacoima Charter Elementary is operated by Pacoima Charter School, a California nonprofit public benefit corporation that does not operate any other LAUSD-authorized charter schools.

IV. STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AND EDUCATIONAL PERFORMANCE

a. Summary

Pacoima Charter Elementary has been identified by the state as a Middle performing charter school. The recommendation for renewal has considered the schoolwide performance and performance of numerically significant student groups and the state and local indicators reported on the California School Dashboard, and whether there was clear and convincing verified data evidence showing the school demonstrated measurable increases in academic achievement, as defined by at least one year's progress in each year in school, and/or strong postsecondary outcomes, as applicable.

Overall, Charter School's Dashboard performance was higher than the state in ELA and Math for all numerically significant student groups, and higher than the state on the English Language Progress Indicator (ELPI). The charter school provided three years of verified data, demonstrating one year's progress for the majority of grade levels and for the majority of numerically significant student groups in ELA and Math.

VI. VERIFIED DATA

Pacoima Charter Elementary submitted verified data for consideration as part of its renewal application.

Charter School provided data for Reading from "i-Ready K-8 by Curriculum Associates" (i-Ready) *Diagnostic Growth* report for 2022-2023, 2023-2024, and 2024-2025 ("Final Diagnostic") for All Students and for the following student groups: Latino, English Learner, Socioeconomically Disadvantaged, and Students with Disabilities. i-Ready is an adopted academic progress indicator approved by the SBE to be on the verified data list.

Per Education Code section 47607.2 (c)(2), the SBE established criteria to define verified data. To be eligible for inclusion as verified data, a data source (e.g., assessment or postsecondary outcome) must include the results of at least 95 percent of eligible students. Although the i-Ready *Diagnostic Growth* report shows the number of students assessed and the number of students currently enrolled, i-Ready's publisher (Curriculum Associates) has shared that these numbers do not constitute an official participation rate that would reflect which students *should* have been tested, thereby an official participation rate is not provided. The *Diagnostic Growth* report provided by Charter School reported 796 students were assessed in Reading and 806 students were enrolled in i-Ready. Thus, based on the information provided by Charter School, the 2024-2025 assessment data appears to include at least 95% of eligible students.

Per the California State Board of Education May 2023 Agenda Item #02, publisher guidance states, "Typical Growth marks the annual growth of an average student at a given placement. It provides a comparative or normative view of growth, answering how students are growing relative to comparable peers." i-Ready's Median Progress to Typical Growth targets¹ identify schools as having met California

¹ In 2023, Curriculum Associates revised typical growth targets in Reading to be 75% in Grades K-5 and 45% in Grades 6-8.

Charter School growth expectations, based on Curriculum Associates' recommendation "that schools that achieve a year's worth of growth, adjusted for error, have exhibited sufficient growth."

Charter School provided 2022-2023, 2023-2024, and 2024-2025 data for grades K-6. For the purposes of verified data, i-Ready has separate recommended targets for Grades K-5 and 6-8. Per Curriculum Associates' published guidance, grade-specific Progress to Annual Typical Growth values can be used to evaluate one-year's progress by grade level for schools with configurations other than Grades K-5 and 6-8.

As seen in the table below, six of seven grade levels met one year's progress based on i-Ready's Median Progress to Typical Growth Targets. Charter School's submitted data also included data for four student groups (English Learner, Latino, Socioeconomically Disadvantaged students, and Students with Disabilities) and demonstrated one year's progress for a majority of student groups based on i-Ready's Median Progress to Typical Growth Targets.

Charter School also submitted verified data using i-Ready for the 2022-2023, 2023-2024, and 2024-2025 school years. Based on i-Ready's Median Progress to Typical Growth targets, Charter School met the one year's progress for a majority of grade levels and met the one year's progress for a majority of student groups in Reading in 2023-2024. Based on i-Ready's prior Typical Growth target of 50% of the students making 100% Typical Growth, Charter School met the one year's progress for All Students and for the majority student groups in Reading in 2022-2023.

Per Curriculum Associates' published guidance, grade-specific Progress to Annual Typical Growth values can be used to evaluate one-year's progress by grade level for schools with configurations other than Grades K-5 and 6-8.

As seen in the table below, six of seven grade levels met one year's progress based on i-Ready's Median Progress to Typical Growth Targets. Charter School's submitted data also include data for four student groups (English Learner, Latino, Socioeconomically Disadvantaged, and Students with Disabilities) and demonstrated one year's progress for a majority of student groups based on i-Ready's Median Progress to Typical Growth Targets.

Charter School also submitted verified data using i-Ready for the 2022-2023, 2023-2024, and 2024-2025 school years. Based on i-Ready's Median Progress to Typical Growth targets, Charter School met the one year's progress for a majority of grade levels and a majority of student groups met the one year's progress in Math in 2023-2024. Based on i-Ready's prior Typical Growth target of 50% of the students making 100% Typical Growth, Charter School met the one year's progress for All Students and for the majority student groups in Math in 2022-2023.

Based on the review and consideration of verified data, Pacoima Charter Elementary included three years of data, including schoolwide and student group reports (English Learner, Latino, Socioeconomically Disadvantaged, and Students with Disabilities) for both ELA and Math. In 2022-2023, 2023-2024 and 2024-2025, Pacoima Charter Elementary appears to have met 95 percent participation rate for schoolwide and all numerically significant student groups.

³ According to Pacoima Charter Elementary, the net income reported for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 was attributed to a significant increase in other state revenues of approximately \$5.1M and a significant decrease (adjustment) of \$3.4M in the OPEB liability as reported in its FY 2022-2023 independent audit report.

⁴ According to Pacoima Charter Elementary, the net loss reported for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 was primarily due to an increase in OPEB expense of \$502K, as noted in Charter School's 2023-2024 independent audit report.
